TOWN OF PLAINFIELD ANNUAL TOWN MEETING MINUTES

The annual Town Meeting was held outside behind the Town Offices at 304 Main St. on a chilly Saturday May 1, 2021. The Annual Town Meeting was called to order by the Town Clerk at 1:11 pm

Article 1. To vote by official ballot for all Town Officers, Committees, Trustees, etc., and to fix compensation for the same.

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or otherwise provide such amounts of money as are reasonable and necessary to defray the expenses of the town for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, or take any other action relative thereto.

All budgets Items passed

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds a sum of money to operate the broadband enterprise: Salaries/Stipends \$6,000.00, Expenses: \$270,657.00 Extra/Unforeseen: \$20,459.00, and that the amount of \$297,116.00 be raised as follows: \$297,116.00 from Broadband Departmental Receipts, or take any action relative thereto.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to allow the Mohawk Trail Regional School District to borrow a sum of money, not to exceed \$318,000 for repair work to Sanderson Academy, Ashfield, Massachusetts, to include rebuilding or resurfacing of parking lots and certain walkways; repair/replacement/upgrading of certain flooring, siding, doors and windows; addition of roof snow bars and heating cables to certain roof areas; replacement of the fire alarm control panel and system sensors; completion of essential service on the sanitary sewer water treatment system; replacement of refrigeration condenser units; replacement of restroom exhaust fans; and replacement of removable wall partition; and including costs incidental or related thereto, which purpose of the projects will materially extend the useful life of the school and preserve the asset capable of supporting the required educational program. Said sum is to be expended under the approval of the School Committee's Building Subcommittee and, to meet said appropriation, the District Treasurer, with the approval of the Chair, is authorized to borrow said sum under MGL Ch. 44 or any other enabling authority. *Inserted by the MTRSD*

To see if the town will vote to allow the Mohawk Trail Regional School District to borrow a sum of money, not to exceed \$382,850 for work at Buckland Shelburne Elementary in Shelburne, Massachusetts, to include rebuilding or resurfacing of parking lots and certain walkways; replacement of the fire alarm control panel and related sensors; replacement of a pneumatic heating control system; replacement of a heating system boiler and domestic hot water tanks; and replacement of restroom exhaust fans; and including costs incidental or related thereto, which purpose of the projects swill materially extend the useful life of the school and preserve the asset capable of supporting the required educational program. Said sum is to be expended under the approval of the School Committee's Building Subcommittee, and to meet said appropriation, the District Treasurer, with the approval of the Chair, is authorized to borrow said sum under MGL Ch. 44 or any other enabling authority.

To see if the Town will vote to leave the care, maintenance and repair of the Town Hall, Shaw Memorial Library, Hallock Memorial School Building, Hathaway Hall, Firehouse, Town Garage, Police Station, Public Safety Building, and surrounding areas, in the charge of the Buildings Committee, or take any other action relative thereto.

Article 28.
