

## Plainfield Transfer Station

### User Guidelines

**FEES:** you can pick up a schedule of fees at the Transfer Station.

1. Garbage goes into the compacter. Punch cards are used to pay the fee, which depends on the size of the bag. The cards can be purchased from the attendant or the Town Clerk with a check for \$37.50 made out to the Town of Plainfield. No cash is accepted.
2. Scrap Metals and Bulky Items: see the attendant before depositing them in either of the two open top containers. Pay the fees with a check. The TS does not accept mattresses and box springs; bring them to the Williamsburg Transfer Station for recycling. Ask the attendants for information.
3. Electronics: see the attendant before depositing them in Electronics Shed. Pay the fees with a check.

### Procedures:

1. Using the open top containers: read the signs and ask the attendant if you need help: metals and mostly metal containing items only in the Metals container; demolition and construction debris, furniture, mattresses, large plastic items, etc. belong in the Bulky container. Careful sorting helps the Town avoid added costs and fines.
2. Recycling containers:
  - a. Bottles and Cans & Paper Food & Beverage Cartons: please rinse them out.
    - i. Items that aren't recycled: plate glass, canning jars, black plastic, Styrofoam food containers, plant pots, plastic bags, paper, prescription medicine bottles, and plastic bottles that contained motor oil, windshield washer fluid or other toxic materials, and aerosol cans.
  - b. Paper: cardboard flattened, pizza boxes, stained or clean, mixed paper, such as mail, magazines, newspaper, non-foil Christmas wrapping, egg cartons.
    - i. Items that aren't recycled: wet or soiled cardboard, shredded paper, plastic bags, used Kleenex and paper towels, and books (put them in the book recycling box).
  - c. Textiles and other apparel: clean, used clothing, regardless of condition, rags, shoes, belts, etc.
  - d. Books: clean and dry books, CD's and DVD's.
